A 2008 study adds that many pieces of research have also noted that cannabinoids offer benefits specifically for “difficult to treat pain.” [5] For instance, researchers reference how Canada approved a cannabis-derived nasal spray called Sativex in 2005 for relieving central neuropathic pain in people with multiple sclerosis.
